Today was Mrs Master's last day at school as she is starting her maternity leave. We wish her all the best and look forward to welcoming her back to school next year.

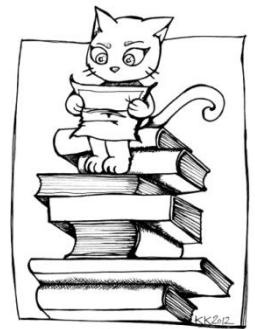


Congratulations to Mrs Madhvani who has a new baby boy.

Please make sure your child brings a coat to school every day. We play outside every day whenever we can. The weather is very unpredictable at the moment.

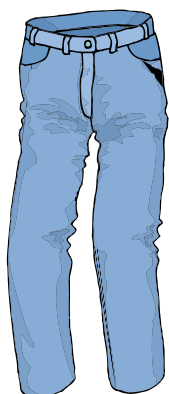
Eid at Sandfield Close

Students attend school in their choice of footwear, whilst handing over a pair of unwanted shoes that can be used again in rural Africa. We pay 50p per kilo for reusable shoes, and then transport them to Africa, where they are introduced into communities sensitively*. We collect the shoes from school on the Happy Feet Day, so there are no storage problems. We weigh them and make swift payment. All we ask is that the shoes are clean, paired and tied together....

*our focus is on empowering community members rather than perpetuating a dependency culture and we work with key personnel to make this happen.



Any money we raise will be used by our Eco Club to fund environmental projects at Sandfield Close.

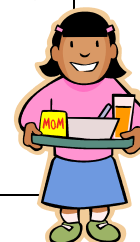
Everybody's Reading Tuesday 29th September
