Eisteddfod

The sword is used in a ceremony. In the ceremony the person with the best poem will win a chair or crown. They shall sit on the chair and have a sword pulled over their head three times!

Things to do... You can sing, dance, recite a poem, play an instrument, get ice cream, stalls, eat junk, shop, get prizes, playground and more!

Druids/bards wear cloaks, bands are important in ceremonies. Bards or Druids can be poets, writers or someone people...

Fun fact: The sword is the most important!

Eisteddfodau can be held all around the world but mostly in villages!

The Udd Eisteddfod!

The pink tent is where the main competitions are held. This includes singing, playing a instrument, reciting a poem, dancing and acting. You can do other things like shopping or go to the many cafes. The sword ceremony is important but doesn't happen in the Udd. The druids pull the sword halves out of the hilt to show who won the poetry competition.

Eisteddfod

There are many competitions in the Eisteddfod including... dancing, singing, poetry reciting, poetry reading, and chess.

Things to do in the Eisteddfod... You can sing, dance, recite a poem, play a instrument, eat and play sports.

Flower girls dance around the sword and while the sword ceremony is being held they traditionally dance in a circle.

Eisteddfodau are sometimes played in a chapel, a village, but it can be placed in other countries, unless a Welsh person chooses it because Eisteddfodau are a Welsh thing.

Eisteddfodau aren't all about competitions, there are lots of other things like stalls, shops, food, sports, and activities.

Fun facts! Around 35 acres of mostly flat land is used to hold the National Eisteddfod. The Eisteddfod attracts over 16,000 people to the area during the event.

Competitions... In the Eisteddfod the competitions are: Art competition, handwriting competition but most of it is just for fun like singing songs and doing traditional dancing, also eating ice cream!

Where to stay! In some Eisteddfodau you can bring your own tent and also you can bring your own tent and the people there will assist you in the caravan park.

What to do... In the Eisteddfod you can shop at different stalls. You can also do different things at sports there. There is also other activities like a fun fair and temporary and much more.

Ceremony! In the ceremony you can see a sword about a meter and people playing the trumpet.

SWORD EISTEDDFOD FACTS COUNTRY

The sword is used in a ceremony the ceremony is where the person with the best poem gets a prize of a crown/chair. The person sits in a chair and pulls the sword out and puts it back 3 times. It's about 1m long.

It's done in Wales where everyone comes from specially Welsh people sometimes do it in chapels and villages.

They sing, dance, recite poems, play instruments, eat, have ice cream.

These girls in the Eisteddfod have flowers and dance.

Eisteddfod

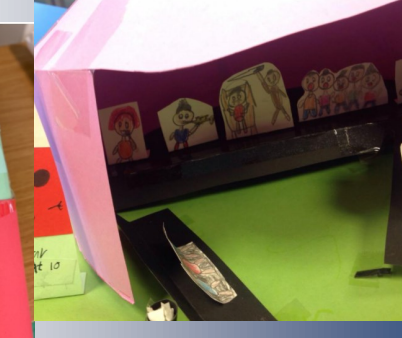
Eisteddfod are sometimes held in chapels. They dance, sing, play an instrument, and eat in the Eisteddfod.

If you see a bunch of staves in a circle it means that people are having/had an Eisteddfod.

Flower girls dance around the sword and while the sword ceremony is being held they traditionally dance in a circle.

The people in the cloaks are called druids/bards and they control the sword. They are important people and they have done good things in Wales but it could be anyone.

The sword is used in the ceremony on the best poet as the prize. They have to sit on the chair and the sword is raised above their head and opened and closed. Then they have to make their own shape while trumpets are playing.
