Iechyd a Lles / Health and Well-being- 2. How did a child's diary impact on the world?

Research the different aspects of Anne Frank's life using a range of reading behaviours. Focus on features of recount and write a diary entry based on the point of view of a child who survived the 3-night blitz. Create a short play using information found from the school logbooks. Children to research the different aspects of the different religions e.g. God and symbols. Create a fact sheet about the religion. Look at the role of faith during the Holocaust. What traditions did the Frank family follow when in hiding? Children to look at symbol of faith and signs of belonging, why are they important? Link in with symmetry. Look at Hindus, Christians and Muslims. What religions /community groups can be found in the local community? How have local places of worship commemorated and honoured those who fought and died in the war? How do local groups commemorate Armistice Day. Liaise with local leaders and Keep Wales Tidy and litter pick and help tidy local memorials. Identify and analyse the book sales of the Anne Frank's diary and find out the impact these profits have had on various organisations. Budget task - how many Anne Frank books can you buy for Ysgol yr Hendy with a given budget? Converting Euros into £.



Y Celfyddydau Mynegiannol / Expressive Arts- 4. How can we make do and mend Christmas in a sustainable way?

To create a graphic score to represent the Swansea bombing. To perform and assess a popular World War dance i.e. the Charleston, Lambeth Walk and Lindy Hop. To create a Christmas decoration using recycled materials to sell. Using the style of Josef Herman (Holocaust survivor) who was famous for his depiction of the upper Swansea Valley, the children will apply this to recreate a picture of Hendy in his distinctive style. Plan and budget a wartime Christmas dessert using the rations for a family of 4. Create a range of propaganda posters for the people of Hendy to encourage them to act in a sustainable manner during the Christmas period.



Y Dyniaethau / Humanities -1. War, what is it good for?

What did Europe/Swansea look like before WW2? Who were the world leaders and what was their motivation? How was Hendy governed during the war period and how was Hendy affected by the events in Swansea? Use the school log books to gather further information about the impact the war had on the children of Hendy. Introduce the class novel Swansea Spy- investigate the blurb and predict what might happen in the story. Comparing Swansea's 1940 maps to modern day maps i.e. google maps, aerial maps. How did the blitz impact on the landscape of the town? After the war, many towns and cities had to rebuild homes that were lost during the bombings, what would be the impact building more houses have on Hendy. Comparing death and injury statistics e.g. how many more people died in London than Swansea? Comparing population data of main cities before and after World War II. Input data onto a spreadsheet so children can use formulas to calculate averages etc. Create trump cards about Welsh places, including death and injury data. Children to set open questions to ask a local resident who lived in Hendy during the war. Use atlases to identify Welsh places and note their co-ordinates. Use outdoor learning area to locate these places, Use distances and compass directions.



Gwyddoniaeth a Thechnoleg / Science & Technology-3. How do planes fly?

Visit Hendy Park to investigate how the motion of objects can be affected by applying specific forces. Research aircrafts that were used during the Battle of Britain. Create a variety of spitfire models and to describe the forces that act upon it. The spitfire was an extremely noisy plane, how is sound made and how does it travel? Air raid sirens alerted people to the threat of oncoming attacks. How did the ear hear the warnings? To create an air raid siren to alert Gwyn and his family in Swansea Spy of the oncoming German attack. The children will compare their siren to how effective it is to a real air raid siren that was used at Ysgol yr Hendy by measuring the distance from the siren. A lever is a simple machine which helps us to lift objects, design a lever to help clear the rubble caused by a German attack in Swansea.
