<u>Language, Literacy and</u> <u>Communication</u>

Throughout our literacy, learners will have the opportunity to write a 5-part portal story and an explanation text. We will explore a variety of poetry techniques. We will also be using Talk4Writing and Oracy 21 to further enhance our literacy skills.

Our class novel this term will be 'Letters From the Lighthouse' and 'Anna's War'.

<u>Topic</u>

Our first topic of this term is 'Behind Enemy Lines'. We will be exploring this topic across the curriculum linking in science, geography, Welsh and art, and the teaching will support the development of literacy, numeracy and ICT skills. Throughout this topic, the children will be at the centre of their learning in planning what they would like to find out.

Physical Development

This term, PE will be on a Thursday this term. These sessions will be taught by the WRU Officer and will focus on the development of multi-skills. Please could the pupils wear their PE kit to school on a Thursday.

Curriculum Focus for this term

Was it necessary for children to be evacuated?
How was rationing organised?

Welsh Language Development

This term, we will be using the new Welsh continuum in our weekly Welsh lessons. Our focus this term will be on describing past events and expressing an opinion. In addition to our weekly lessons, the children will also be involved in daily Oracy and reading sessions throughout the week to support their Welsh language development.

Mathematical Development

Throughout the term we will continue to develop the children's mental arithmetic skills and knowledge of the four operations.

This term we will be focusing on:

- Fraction, decimal and percentage equivalences
- Percentage quantities
- Ratio
- Function Machines and Algebra
- Data Handling
- Converting measurements
- Mean, median, mode and range
- Angles
- Area
- Probability

Religious Education

The pupils will be taught the Come and See themes: based on the Church, Sacrament and Christian living. The children will explore the following topics and big questions.

Sources - Are books enriching?

Unity - Why are we happiest when we are united when we are united?

Death & New Life - Can any good come out of loss and death?

Our virtues this term will be Intentional and Prophetic and Grateful and Generous.

<u>Science</u>

Science continues to be taught through 'hands on' investigation, where children will further develop skills and expand their knowledge and understanding. Children will work on identifying what variables are and how to control them. They will experience taking measurements from a range of equipment, understanding the need for repeated measures to increase accuracy.
