From Monday 13th November, we will be trialling changes to morning drop-off, where we ask parents to drop their child off at the gate and not come onto the playground. Teachers will supervise play for learners dropped off at the gate and learners in breakfast club from 8.30am until the start of the school day. The Nursery/Reception entrance will be open for parents dropping learners off to Amroth class. In rainy conditions, learners will go straight into classes as usual. We will review this change over the next few weeks with the Department of Health and Wellbeing.
