Cân Actol

Earlier in the term, the Cân Actol group performed on the County Eisteddfod stage front of hundreds of people. They represented the school beautifully and have secured a place at the National Eisteddfod for Wales. The children have received news this week that they would like to share with you:

"Cân Actol is a very important aspect of our school life. We are going to be the 1st to go to the National Eisteddfod for Cân Actol in our school's history. It is basically singing in Welsh and dancing, we are working very hard to make sure it is the best piece that we can possibly do. We got through the first round however we found out this week that the children will have to pay £8 each to get into the eisteddfod and adults have to pay £18, we worked out that it will cost £240 for the children to get onto stage, that is without any teachers or adults and without a bus to Llandovery. Welsh is a very important thing for us, not just in school but the children's appreciation of the Welsh language and our culture. We have learned a lot and are very excited that we are going to get on that stage and go down in history! Miss Mansfield has already said that the school would pay for the bus to take us there, but we were not expecting the additional charge to represent our school on the national stage. Year five and six were presented with this dilemma earlier today and we have decided that we are going to hold the disco for all of us children. The disco will be on **Friday 19th May** at the following times:

Nursery, Reception, Year 1 & 2 will be from 3:30pm - 4:30pm

- Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 will be from 5pm - 6pm

We will be charging £3 per child and you can bring some pocket money to spend at the tuc shop. We are so excited that we get to plan this disco and we really hope that you can all make it. "Performing on the national stage will be an amazing opportunity for all of the children involved in the Cân Actol. RSE Dosbarth Little Haven:

Next week we will be revisiting the session on Keeping safe: Physical contact. This session incorporates The 'PANTS' resources from the NSPCC that teach children:

- · Privates are private.
- Always remember your body belongs to you.
- No means no.
- Talk about secrets that upset you.
- Speak up, someone can help.

Dosbarth Marloes

In this session, pupils will relate their prior knowledge of medicines and the need to be safe around them to new learning about harmful substances. Children will receive input from an animated expert, Dr Datfa, on the harm substances such as alcohol and tobacco can have on our bodies. This session is underpinned with the religious teaching that our bodies are a gift from God which we should take care of.

Dosbarth Newgale:

'When things feel bad.' In this session, children will learn how to recognise bullying and abuse (including physical bullying and emotional bullying online). Children will take part in discussions and roleplay activities to consider how bullying affects people, and what strategies can be employed to resist pressure and practise resilience.

Dosbarth Whitesands:

'Giving Assistance' The animated Dr Datfa features in this session to equip children with some basic First Aid knowledge, including the recovery position and the DR ABC primary survey. This is underpinned with the religious teaching that God created us to love Him and to love others, so we should look out for and care for one another.

Dosbarth Abereiddy:

'The Holy Trinity' This session helps pupils increase their understanding of the Holy Trinity using Scripture activities and prayer. Children will also consider how they can allow the Holy Spirit to work through them to share God's love in the world.
