Specialist Learning Disabilities Psychological Services for Children and Young People

The service uses a Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) framework which is person <u>centred</u>, ethical and based upon <u>behavioural</u> science.

PBS is holistic and systemic; It takes into account the young person and their physical, social and psychological world.



PBS aims to reduce <u>behaviours</u> that challenge by facilitating and adapting the environment around the child/young person in order to better meet their needs.

PBS is proactive and preventative and teaches skills to the child, family and professionals.

The service also provides advice and consultation to families and other organizations within Health, Social Services, Education and the Third Sector using a PBS framework.

Who is the service for?

Children and Young People between the ages of 0 to 25 (and their families), who have a Learning Disability who struggle with day to day activities and engage in behaviours that challenge those around them.



What are the goals of the service?

- To understand the reason why the child/young person needs to use <u>behaviour</u> that challenges.
- To work together, as a team, with everyone involved with the child/young person to try and reduce the need for behaviours that challenge.
- To improve the quality of life for the child/young person and their family in relation to the <u>behaviours</u> that challenge.


